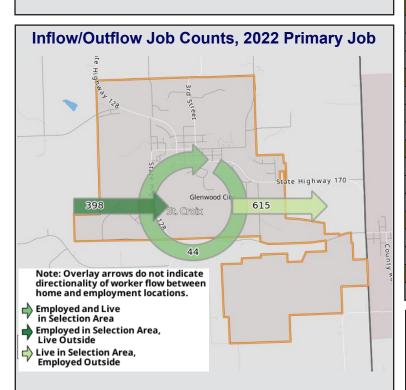
# City of Glenwood City Housing Snapshot

### Housing Summary (2020 U.S. Census):

- The mix of occupied housing units in Glenwood City is 39% Rental / 61% Owner.
- There is a need for additional renter units in the City with a rental vacancy rate of 1.0%.
- There is a slight need for additional owner units in the City with an owner vacancy rate of 1.9%.
- Approximately 0.6% of the City's housing stock is for seasonal, recreational, or occasional use.



- 7% of Glenwood City residents who are employed have a primary job inside the City while 93% leave the City for work.
- 50% of Glenwood City's workforce lives in St. Croix County, 20% in Dunn County, 3% each in Pierce and Polk Counties, with the remainder in other counties.

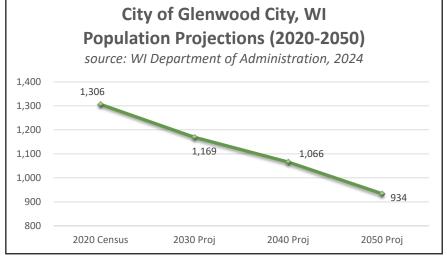
- Additional Local Housing Information:
  The City reported two new housing units, both single-family homes, constructed from 2020 to June 2024.
- Land availability has been identified as a barrier to meeting the community's housing needs.
- The median sale price for housing in the Glenwood City School District increased 14.8% between 2022 and 2024, from \$209,000 in 2022 to \$240,000 in 2024.

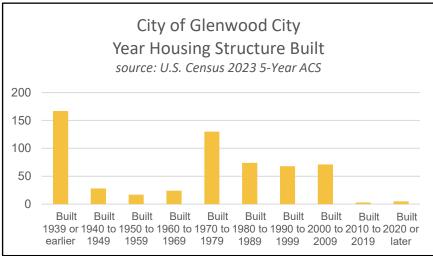

- Total population in the City has increased about 10% over the last 20 years.
- Median age in the City has increased 3 years from 2000 to 2020.
- There is slight growth in the number of smaller households in the City. In 2000, 29.3% of households were comprised of one person while in 2020 this percentage increased to 31%.
- Owner vacancy rate remains below the healthy range of 2-2.5%.
- Growth in single-family and significant increase in multi-family units within the City from 2000 to 2020.
